#### **New Defibrillator**



The Parish Council has purchased another new defibrillator for the Village Hall. We had a £600 donation from one of our District Councillors, Cllr Jane Wood and a grant from the National Lottery Awards for All. The new defibrillator can be found on the outside corner of the village Hall by the bottom of the slope to the main entrance.

# Hands-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)

With the risk of coronavirus (Covid-19) The Resuscitation Council are advising NOT to give rescue breaths and to perform Handsonly CPR. Hands-only CPR can still increase a person's chance of survival.

## When a person collapses in front of you, or you find somebody who has collapsed:

Check the area is safe, shake the person gently, and if unresponsive shout for help, and call 999. The emergency services will reassure you and talk you through CPR. If the casualty is not responsive and not breathing, then their heart has stopped working and they are having a cardiac arrest.

Do not put your face close to theirs. If you think there's risk of infection, use a towel or a piece of clothing and lay it over their mouth and nose. Put one hand on top of the other, interlinking your fingers. Your hand on the bottom should have the fingers open. Lock your fingers together, knuckles up. Then push down, in the middle of the chest right on the breast bone with the heel of your hand. Push down five or six centimetres. Push hard and fast about two times a second, to the beat of Stayin' Alive. Do not worry about hurting someone. A cracked rib can be mended so concentrate on saving a life until the ambulance arrives.

# To use a defibrillator, follow these simple steps:

- Step 1: Turn the defibrillator on by pressing the green button and follow its instructions.
- Step 2: Peel off the sticky pads and attach them to the patient's skin, one on each side of the chest, as shown in the picture on the defibrillator.
- Step 3: Once the pads have been attached, stop CPR and don't touch the patient. The defibrillator will then analyse the patient's heart rhythm.
- Step 4: The defibrillator will assess whether a shock is needed and if so, it will tell you to press the shock button. An automatic defibrillator will shock the patient without prompt. Do not touch the patient while they are being shocked.
- Step 5: The defibrillator will tell you when the shock has been delivered and whether you need to continue CPR.
- Step 6: Continue with chest compressions until the patient shows signs of life or the defibrillator tells you to stop so it can analyse the heartbeat again.

The Parish Council will be organising more face to face CPR and defibrillator training in the near future.
